

Anti-capitalist, Anti-globalist and Radical Green Movements

The subject line of this email is the subtitle of the best quick-guide (dummy's guide, if you will) I've come across on the broad spectrum of late 20thC and current movements against neoliberalism and its cohorts: Derek Wall's "Babylon and Beyond" (London: Pluto Press, 2005).

Wall is a prominent eco-socialist and has been a leading figure in the UK Green Party and associated efforts in Europe (here is the Wikipedia link:

In this book, after succinctly distinguishing between classic capitalism and corporate neoliberalism, he clearly, in straightforward non-jargon language, delineates seven kinds of efforts (each encompassing diverse membership), sometimes cooperating sometimes fighting each other, to overcome the globalist behemoth:

- 1) anticapitalist capitalisms
- 2) anticorporationalisms
- 3) green localisms
- 4) monetarisms
- 5) marxisms
- 6) anarchisms and autonomisms
- 7) ecosocialisms

It's good to know who your friends are, and how their goals and thinking agree with yours when they do, and how (and why) they differ when they don't.
